



Did You Know?

To meet the needs of patients, the Red Cross must collect 15,000 units of blood each day.

80% of donations are collected at blood drives, hosted by generous sponsors - close to where people live and work.

The Red Cross needs over 60,000 blood drive sponsors willing to hold 2 or more drives a year to ensure blood is available when needed.

- **SABBATH SCHOOL QUARTERLY (TRADITIONAL, CHAPEL)**— Current study theme: “Adventist Churches That Make a Difference”. The authors, Drs. Gaspar and May-Ellen Colón, show how Christ’s ministry to people’s physical as well as spiritual needs is a model for the Christian Church today. Using a fishing analogy, they stress that Christians need to assist their neighbors with (1) relief (giving hungry people a “fish”); (2) personal development (teaching people how to “fish”); (3) community development (providing “fishing tools”); and (4) social justice (ensuring that all have equal access to the “fishing pond”).
