They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken.

(1) **Campus Security Manager.** Nine hours a week, \$15 per hour. Responsibilities: • Inspecting campus 7 nights a week from 9:00-10:00 p.m. to ensure all doors and gates are locked and lights/climate control systems are off. On Saturday night, putting all temporary signage away in addition to regular rounds. • Opening church campus on Saturday mornings from 8:00-9:00 a.m. Unlocking all doors, turning on lights, making sure thermostats are set correctly, and setting up our temporary interior and exterior directional signs.
